
CENTRAL STATE UNIVERSITY

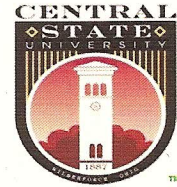

General Notes:

Additional general education courses will be required for the B.S. in Criminal Justice. (i.e., ENG, HIS, Physical Activity and MTH). General Sociology I & II, Introduction to Psychology (General Psychology I & II), and American National Government will fulfill the requirement for 9 hours in Social and Behavioral Sciences. Foreign Language requirement may be fulfilled with courses in Spanish, French, Chinese, German, etc. Students must take the first and second courses in one language area. **Please contact your Sinclair and CSU Academic Advisors** regarding criminal justice electives taken at Sinclair.

All students must satisfy the English proficiency requirement by testing or passing ENG 3000.

Students 25 or older are exempted from the physical education activity requirement.
