

Programmatic Articulation Agreement
Clark State and Central State University
School of Agricultural Education and Food Science
Pathway from A.A.B. in Agriculture at Clark State
TO B.S. in Agricultural Education at Central State University
Established July 15, 2017

This pathway agreement will allow students enrolled at Clark State Community College, pursuing an Associates of Applied Business in Agriculture, to complete a Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Education at Central State University.

While enrolled at Clark State, any student pursuing an A.A.B in Agriculture can declare themselves as a candidate to pursue a B.S. in Agricultural Education at Central State University. To complete the transfer pathway program, students must meet the following criteria:

1. Complete all requirements for the A.A.B in Agriculture at Clark State Community College.
2. Complete General Education Requirements for Central State University as outlined in this agreement.
3. Enroll and complete EDU 2500 – Professional Education Seminar through SOCHE during their second Year.
 - EDU 2500 will substitute for AGR 2850 Capstone Requirement in the A.A.B at Clark State.
 - In cases where twelve or more students enroll in EDU 2500 through SOCHE at Clark State during the same semester, Central State will offer this course as a section at Clark State’s Springfield Campus. If fewer than 12 students enroll, students will travel to Central State University’s Wilberforce Campus to complete EDU 2500.
4. Apply for Admission to the Education Preparation Program (EPP) at Central State University by **October 15 for Spring Admission, or April 15 for Fall Admission.**

5. Meet all requirements for acceptance to Central State University EPP, as outlined in this agreement.
 - A. Have a 2.75 or higher collegiate GPA.
 - B. Earn a grade of B or better in English 1101, English 1102, and Math 1750.
 - C. Have completed 32-36 college credits.
 - D. Have a pre-admission interview with staff of the Teacher Education Advising and Placement Center Staff (TEAP-C) and the School of Agricultural Education and Food Science.
 - E. Provide professional recommendations.
 - F. Provide a current and clear FBI/BCI background check.

Once a student has been admitted to the Education Preparation Program (EPP), he or she must demonstrate competency on the Ohio Assessment for Educator Exam in order to pursue the Secondary 7-12, or 4-9 Ohio Teaching License issued by The Ohio Department of Education. Competency on these exams is demonstrated by meeting the State benchmark on the following Assessments:

OAE Pedagogy Assessment

002 Assessment of Professional Knowledge: Middle Childhood (4–9)

OR 003 Assessment of Professional Knowledge: Adolescence to Young Adult (7–12)

As part of the pathway completion, students will complete related courses to prepare them for the exams including EDU 3263, EDU3264, EDU 3265, and AGED4100.

OAE Content Assessment

005 Agriscience

As part of the pathway completion, students will complete related courses to prepare them for the exams including AGB 2300, AGR 3150, AGR3250, AGR1150, AGR1220, AGR2450, AGR2150, and AGED3110.

Students who transfer any of these related courses through a programmatic agreement and cannot demonstrate competency on the OAE content assessment, may need to complete additional coursework or test preparation one or more content areas at Central State University until they have passed the exams.

Students cannot be placed in an **EDU 4491 Student Teaching** without the successful completion of these assessments.

At the completion of the Pathway program, successful students will have earned

- Associate Degree in Applied Business from Clark State Community College
- Bachelor of Science Degree in Agricultural Education from Central State University with a minor in Sustainable Agriculture.
- Ohio Secondary Teaching License in the area of Agriscience.
