



INSTITUTIONAL ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
CENTRAL STATE UNIVERSITY
AND
COLUMBUS STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE



Central State University and Columbus State Community College (both public institutions) recognize the need to facilitate the transfer of students from Columbus State Community College to Central State University to pursue and achieve their educational goals.

Central State University (Wilberforce, OH) has a 124 year history of educating students for leadership and service to the state, nation, and world. The University was founded by the Ohio General Assembly in 1887 as the Combined Normal and Industrial Department at Wilberforce University. Operating separately since 1947, the University offers baccalaureate degrees in 38 academic majors in 10 departments within the College of Science and Engineering, College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences, the College of Business, and the College of Education. Central State also offers a master's degree in Education. The facilities are valued at more than \$95 million dollars and include the Center for Education and Natural Sciences, Cosby Mass Communications Center, the McLin Center for Water Resources Management, the Paul Robeson Cultural and Performing Arts Center, the Hallie Q. Brown Memorial Library, the Newsom Administration Building, the Ward University Center, the Galloway Tower, the Walter G. Sellers Alumni Center, the Louis Stokes Center on Aging, and the James A. Elam Hall located in Dayton, Ohio. Central State University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

Columbus State Community College (Columbus, OH) has been dedicated to meeting the educational needs of the Central Ohio community for more than 40 years. The College has grown from an initial enrollment of 67 students in 1963, to its current thriving college of more than 28,000 students. In addition to the main campus and the Delaware campus, Columbus State operates 9 off-campus centers in the suburban neighborhoods of Dublin, Gahanna, Westerville, Groveport, Marysville, Delaware, Grove City, Plain City, Southeast Columbus and in Southwest Columbus at Bolton Field. While this Agreement is active and for a period of three years after its completion, the parties agree to maintain auditable records of all charges pertaining to this Agreement and make such records available to Columbus State Community College and Central State University as we may reasonably require.

This agreement is contingent upon the availability of sufficient appropriated funds and the College Treasurers certification that such funds are available as required pursuant to the O.R.C. 3358.10
