WILBERFORCE, OH –Central State University Extension (CSUE) will host its “Journaling: A Year in the Garden” program from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m., Tuesday, Nov. 9, at the CSU Seed to Bloom Botanical and Community Garden located at the intersection of US 42 E and Wilberforce-Switch Road across from the entrance to the university.

The free program for adults will encourage participants to observe nature closely to capture the changes throughout the year. One subject in the garden will be selected by each participant to use as a journaling subject.
