Central State University Extension hosting Pesticide Application Classes at CSU-Xenia

WILBERFORCE, OH –Central State University Extension (CSUE) will host Pesticide Application Classes for trained servicepersons at CSU-Xenia, 334 Progress Dr., Suite 100, Xenia.

Classes will be held from 10 a.m. to noon and repeat from 1 to 3 p.m., on Tuesday, March 1; Tuesday, March 15; and Tuesday, April 5. Participants only need to attend one session to receive certification.

A morning training will be taught in English with an afternoon training including Spanish translation.

Featured speaker will be CSUE Agriculture and Natural Resources Program Leader Dr. Alcinda (Cindy) Folck.

Trained serviceperson certification is required for employees who apply pesticides as part of their job and are supervised by a licensed pesticide applicator. Training will cover safety for pesticide application and a certificate will be given to each participant to meet their employer's obligation for training.

The program is free for adults over the age of 18.
