Central State University Extension hosting “Winter Bird Count: A Citizen Science Project” at CSU Seed to Bloom Botanical and Community Garden

WILBERFORCE, OH –Central State University Extension (CSUE) will host its “Winter Bird Count: A Citizen Science Project” on Saturday, Dec. 11, at the CSU Seed to Bloom Botanical and Community Garden located at the intersection of US 42 E and Wilberforce-Switch Road across the entrance to the university.

Two sessions will be held from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m. (adults over the age of 18) and from 11 a.m. to noon (families and adults.)

The free program for families and adults will offer the opportunity to learn how to participate in the winter bird count for reporting bird species to several national naturalist organizations. Participants are invited to bring hot beverages and binoculars as needed. The Audubon Society monitors bird species from Dec. 14 to Jan. 5, 2022.
