



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
between
CLARK STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE
and
CENTRAL STATE UNIVERSITY

This Articulation Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into on this 1st day of May, 2013 (the "Effective Date") by and between Clark State Community College ("Clark State"), with an address of 570 E. Leffel Lane, Springfield, Ohio 45501; and Central State University ("Central State") with an address of 1400 Brush Row Road, P.O. Box 1004, Wilberforce, Ohio 45384. Clark State is an institution of higher education established pursuant to Section 3358 of the Ohio Revised Code, and Central State is an institution of higher education established pursuant to Section 3343 of the Ohio Revised Code. Clark State and Central State desire to enter into a contract pursuant to which students of Clark State would be eligible for articulated course credits at Central State, according to the terms contained in the Memorandum of Agreement for the Completion Pathway Program and this Agreement.

Central State University (Wilberforce, OH) established in 1887 educates students with diverse backgrounds for leadership and service to the state of Ohio, the nation, and the world. The University fosters academic excellence through a strong liberal arts foundation and majors in selected professional fields. Central State University seeks to collaborate with other educational institutions to enrich educational opportunities for students and is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, located at 230 South LaSalle Street, Suite 7-500, Chicago, Illinois 60604-1413, (312) 263-0456 or (800) 621-7440.

Clark State Community College (Springfield, OH) began in 1962 as the Springfield and Clark County Technical Education Program. In 1966 the name was changed to Clark County Technical Institute (CCTI), Ohio's first technical college and then in 1972 CCTI had grown to 1,000 students and officially became Clark Technical College. In the 1970s the College re-examined its mission and determined that programs, which can be transferred to four-year colleges, should be included as a secondary focus. In order to accomplish this, many new courses in humanities and social sciences were added to the curriculum. By 1985 Clark Technical College had developed one of the broadest general education programs of any technical college in the state. It was this solid foundation, together with the many strong technical programs, that made the evolution to a community college a smooth and logical step. In 1988, the Ohio Board of Regents approved the change of Clark Technical College to Clark State Community College. As a result of this action, Clark State added the Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees (university parallel programs) to the nearly 30 technical associate degrees and certificates it had offered for years. The College now has more than 80 degree and certificate programs.

Clark State and Central State desire to enter into a contract pursuant to which students who have earned an Associate of Science degree in Business Administration at Clark State Community College are assured admission to Central State University for courses leading to a Bachelor of Science in

Business Administration with optional concentrations in Entrepreneurship, Management, and Marketing.

To facilitate the transfer of students and to provide them with accurate transfer information, Clark State and Central State agree to the following:

PRINCIPLES OF AGREEMENT

Clark State Community College and Central State University confirm the following points of agreement to assure equal treatment of all transfer and regularly enrolled students:

1. The determination of major program requirements for a Baccalaureate degree shall be the responsibility of authorized representatives of Central State University.
2. For admission to Central State University, the student will be required to earn at least a 2.0 overall grade point average on a four point scale. To be considered for upper division status, transfer students must complete 60 transferable semester hours.
3. If the student switches his/her major to a major not covered by this agreement, transfer credit will be determined on a course-by-course evaluation.
4. No time limit shall be placed on the acceptance of credit transferable from Clark State Community College to Central State University unless there is a specific policy limitation for native students at Central State University.
5. If limitations on enrollment become necessary in upper division courses, Central State University will provide Clark State Community College with quotas. Further, Central State University agrees to allocate a specified number of spaces based upon enrollment data as to the number of qualified transfer students who will be transferring from Clark State Community College.
6. If requested of Clark State Community College and approved by the students involved, transcripts of the perspective transfer students from Clark State Community College will be transmitted to Central State University for the purpose of providing counseling. Likewise, follow-up information will be forwarded to Clark State Community College for reporting the success of students transferring to Central State University.
7. Clark State Community College students transferring to Central State University will be treated the same as native Central State University students of equal class standing when applying for financial aid and in the award and distribution of these funds.
8. Clark State Community College students transferring to Central State University will receive consideration for campus housing on the same basis as Central State University students of equal class standing.
9. Clark State Community College students transferring to Central State University receive equal opportunity for priority registration for upper division classes and have access to other student services on the same basis as native Central State University students of equal class standing.
10. Clark State Community College and Central State University will assign a staff member to serve as a liaison to assure maintenance of communication between the institutions.
11. Either party may initiate the termination of this Agreement upon six months written notification to the other party. Students in progress will be permitted to complete the program. Review of this agreement should be initiated every three academic years.

Graduates of Clark State Community College who have completed the requirements of the Associate of Science Degree and have completed courses as indicated for the Business Transfer program (see Attachments) will receive credit for their Clark State coursework towards the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration Degree (Options in Entrepreneurship, Management, and Marketing) at Central State University.


This agreement will be in effect on the date indicated below and continue for a period of three years, after which time officials from both institutions will make any necessary revisions.
