ACADEMIC DISHONESTY POLICY

It is the philosophy of the Program that academic dishonesty is a completely unacceptable mode of conduct and will not be tolerated in any form. All persons involved in academic dishonesty will be disciplined in accordance with Program and/or University regulations and procedures. Scholastic dishonesty includes but is not limited to cheating, plagiarism, collusion, and submission for credit of any work or materials that are attributable in whole or in part to another person, taking an examination for another person, any act designed to give unfair advantage to a student or the attempt to commit such acts.

HONOR CODE STATEMENT

To obtain a Bachelor of Social Work degree, CSU policies on academic dishonesty are important to the Social Work Program. Social work, like other professions, is based on ethics and values. A key professional value identified by the Code of Ethics of the National Association of Social Workers (NASW), is integrity. Synonyms for integrity are honor, honesty, truthfulness, veracity, reliability and uprightness. The Social Work Program supports a student Honor Code. The student Honor Code acknowledges that when a student is unethical it hurts the identified students, and other students as well. As a group, social workers are responsible for monitoring the professional conduct of their peers.

The Honor Code is the mechanism by which CSU social work students protect the integrity of the group. When a person turns a blind eye to unethical behavior, it weakens our profession and puts future clients at risk. Integrity is important to social workers because we encounter people when they are most vulnerable. Also, our input as professionals can change the course of people's lives. Based on our verbal or written opinions people can be labeled as having emotional issues, convicted of breaking laws, have their children removed from the home, be committed for observation for psychiatric problems, and so forth. It is important that social workers are competent to assess a person, be diligent about producing accurate documentation, and respectful of even their most vulnerable or difficult clients. In response to CSU policies on academic dishonesty, all suspected cases of academic dishonesty will be addressed by the Social Work Program and referred to the Office of the Dean of Students. The Office can impose various sanctions including suspension or dismissal.

The Social Work Program may impose sanctions for academic dishonesty and may impose sanctions for failure to comply with the NASW Code of Ethics, including dismissal from the Social Work Program, or denial of entry into the program and/or field practicum. If you suspect unethical behavior such as academic dishonesty, please report it to your professor. Your professor will take action as outlined in the Social Work Program's Student Manual and/or of the Central State University Student Handbook.

INFORMATION ABOUT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS AND DRUG SCREENING

The program does not require a criminal background check or drug screening for admission into the program. Please be advised that some agencies which the Program uses for practicum may require students to get a criminal background check or to take drug screenings or other medical tests. Additionally, organizations that employ social workers may require criminal background checks as part of the process of applying for jobs.

General Requirements

To be admitted into the Social Work Program at Central State University, each candidate needs:

- 1. To be a student in good standing at Central State University as defined in the current University Catalog.
- 2. To complete a minimum of 3 semester hours of college credits with an overall 2.50 or above GPA
- 3. To complete designated prerequisite course work.
- 4. To complete and submit to the Social Work Program an Application for Admission along with a current academic advising plan developed in consultation with his or her faculty advisor.
- 5. To receive a positive recommendation from a social work teaching faculty member.
- 6. To complete an admission's interview with the Social Work Program Director or designee.

The following <u>REQUIRED</u> courses are to be completed and passed with a "C" or better letter grade before being granted permission to apply to The Social Work Program.

Transfer Credits

Credits may be awarded for traditional course work that has been successfully completed at institutions of higher learning as indicated by Central State University and The Board of Regents.

Qualifications that must be met in order for traditional course work credits to be transferred are listed below:

- 1. Transfer Credit is not given for courses in which the lowest passing grad (D) or a failing grade was received.
- 2. While courses successfully completed and evaluated on a non-traditional grading systems (e.g., pass or fail) are acceptable for transfer, some college departments at Central State University may not accept such credits as fulfillment of necessary graduation requirements.
- 3. Credit granted for "life experience" by an institution previously attended cannot be transferred.
- 4. Grades and honor points earned at other colleges and universities are considered for admission, but are not included in the final computation of the student's cumulative GPA (grade point average). A student must complete at least 24 of their last 30 semester hours in residence at Central State University.
