## Report for funds disbursed to students

Report for funds disbursed to students per the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act- April 01, 2023 – June 30, 2023.

## The requirements for these funds must complete the below criteria.

An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. Central State University (CSU) acknowledged the Certification and Agreement on April 13, 2020.

The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department of Education pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. **CSU has received \$8,841,804 award amount.** 

The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter). **The University disbursed \$101,020 to 95 students.** 

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus

eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. The University disbursed payments to 95 students. All eligible students were disbursed aid per allocation requirements, as outlined under Section 18004(a)(1).

The total pool of eligible students to apply for emergency aid from the CARES funding was 4817.

The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. The University identified the eligible students after receiving the applications from students. The amount disbursed was based upon the student's need at the time of the application and available funds. The funds were disbursed according to students' preference outlined in the application.
